










Ethnicity and sex of doctors in the UK








Please note that ethnicity was unknown for 754 HSTs.

Total consultants = 22,213 from our dataset NB: 115 consultants where age was unknown
















Women in the workforce over time








Who employs consultants?








Full-time vs less-than-full-time and flexible working










Do you see acute unselected admissions or look after general internal medicine patients?









Do you see acute unselected admissions or look after general internal medicine patients?

Do you usually participate in out-of-hours on-call work?




















Impact of rota gaps - consultants




Impact of rota gaps - trainees








Do consultants want to work fewer, more or the same number of PAs in future?












Median contracted and programmed activities (PAs) of consultants






















Are you working in a leadership role?



 My leadership role has a negative impact on my wellbeing




Does your trust/health board allow time in your job plan for you to undertake a leadership role outside of your organisation?






Consultants and job satisfaction


% who said they felt valued 'almost always' or 'most of the time'








Who are the other health professionals?










