Countries where the directorate has worked include China, Malta, Brunei, Dubai, Iceland, India, Malaysia, Oman, Singapore, Switzerland and the USA.

We often work on a cascade model where we train local faculty allowing sustainability as local staff gain teaching skills to use in their own region.

We have a great deal of expertise in developing a faculty of local educators who are able to create resources and deliver educational and leadership programmes tailored to local needs.

Some examples of recent work:

Faculty Development – Swiss Institute of Medical Education. Created faculty of educators who deliver a range of educational and leadership workshops to Swiss doctors

Education and clinical supervision – India. Max healthcare, Aster Med City. A programme which supports supervisors implementing UK IMT programme

Leadership – Malta, we delivered a 2day leadership workshop for a hospital in Malta.

USA – Lahey Clinic, Boston. A series of half-day workshops was commissioned to cover topics including; teaching in clinical settings, supporting residents who need additional support and leadership in medicine.
