### **Falls and Fragility Fracture Audit Programme**

The National Audit of Inpatient Falls (NAIF) is run by the Care Quality Improvement Directorate (CQID) of the Royal College of Physicians (RCP). It is part of the Falls and Fragility Fractures Audit Programme (FFFAP), one of three workstreams that also include the Fracture Liaison Service Database (FLS-DB) and National Hip Fracture Database (NHFD). The programme is commissioned by the Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership (HQIP) and works within a governance structure that includes the programme's Board, Advisory Group and Patient and Carer Panel.

# **Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership**

The Falls and Fragility Fracture Audit Programme is commissioned by the Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership (HQIP) as part of the National Clinical Audit and Patient Outcomes Programme (NCAPOP). HQIP is led by a consortium of the Academy of Medical Royal Colleges and the Royal College of Nursing. Its aim is to promote quality improvement in patient outcomes and, in particular, to increase the impact that clinical audit, outcome review programmes and registries have on healthcare quality in England and Wales. HQIP holds the contract to commission, manage and develop NCAPOP, comprising around 40 projects covering care provided to people with a wide range of medical, surgical and mental health conditions.
