for clinical vice president (CVP) 2025–28

Nominations are invited for the office of CVP for 2025–28. Any three fellows may propose a fellow* of at least 5 years' standing for election as CVP. Members of the RCP Board of Trustees and senior officers must not nominate any candidate for election to this role. The elected candidate will work with the current clinical vice president Dr John Dean to ensure smooth handover of duties, and will take up office on 1 August 2025.

RCP Council will consider the nominations received together with the candidates' curriculum vitae to ensure that the candidates have the necessary experience or knowledge as required by the role description. Council will then nominate fellows for election as CVP. Council may choose not to include candidates whom it decides are not suitably qualified.

Nominees must have been fellows of the RCP for at least 5 years by the close of nominations.

Nominations must be received by the registrar **on or before Monday 16 December 2024**, and the agreement of the nominee must have been obtained. **An electronic copy of the candidate's short curriculum vitae (maximum four sides A4) should also be included with the nomination.**
