Statutory education bodies (SEBs)

Responsible for the support, supervision and delivery of medical training in each of the UK nations. They oversee the work of local education training boards in England and deaneries in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, the bodies responsible for the education and training of doctors at a local level. The Federation of the Royal Colleges of Physicians of the UK

A partnership between the RCP, the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow

- > CPD diary for members and fellows
- > Assessments and exams (eg MRCP)

Medical and Dental Recruitment and Selection (MDRS)

NHS England WTE subgroup that supervises recruitment into postgraduate training across the four nations

Physician Specialty Recruitment Office (PSRO)

Works within MDRS to deliver recruitment to physician specialties, including IMT

Doctors who have not completed a GMC-approved training programme but have the knowledge, skills and experience equivalent to the approved curriculum may still join the specialist register through the <u>portfolio</u> <u>pathway</u> (formerly known as the certificate of eligibility for specialist registration, or the CESR route).
